The United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania is pleased to welcome the Honorable Katayoun M. Copeland as a United States Magistrate Judge. Judge Copeland took the oath of office on June 26, 2026.

U.S. Magistrate Judge Katayoun M. Copeland brings more than three decades of distinguished legal experience to the federal bench, having served in senior leadership roles in both federal and state government, as well as in private practice. A seasoned trial lawyer, she has practiced extensively in multiple state and federal jurisdictions, handling a broad range of criminal and civil matters.

Prior to her appointment, Judge Copeland served for over a decade as an Assistant United States Attorney in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. During her tenure, she was a member of the National Security and Cybercrimes Unit and the Narcotics and Organized Crime Unit. Judge Copeland rose to become Chief of the Criminal Division, where she supervised all criminal charging decisions and advised the United States Attorney on significant criminal matters and policy issues.

Judge Copeland also dedicated more than two decades to public service in the Delaware County District Attorney's Office. Rising through the ranks to become Deputy District Attorney and leader of the County's Drug Task Force, she played a key role in advancing innovative approaches to justice. Judge Copeland founded both Delaware County's Treatment Court and Veterans Court, programs designed to address the underlying challenges facing individuals in the criminal justice system. In 2018, she was appointed District Attorney of Delaware County by the Board of Judges.

Following her public service career, Judge Copeland entered private practice at Lamb McErlane, where she represented corporate and individual clients in a wide range of legal and regulatory matters, including complex commercial litigation, labor disputes, internal investigations, criminal defense, government investigations, and compliance matters.

In addition to her professional accomplishments, Judge Copeland has remained deeply engaged in the legal and civic communities. She is a member of the University of Pennsylvania Carey Law School American Inn of Court, serves on the Board of Trustees of The Baldwin School, and is a member of the Board of Directors of the Delaware County Bar Association. Judge Copeland is also a respected educator and lecturer, having provided instruction and training for numerous federal, state, and local agencies, including the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, the Department of Homeland Security, the Pennsylvania State Police, and the Delaware County Municipal Police Academy.

Judge Copeland received her undergraduate degree from Bryn Mawr College and her law degree from the Temple University Beasley School of Law.
